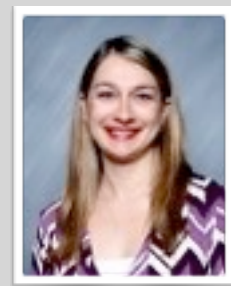

Free conference opportunity for parents of special needs students

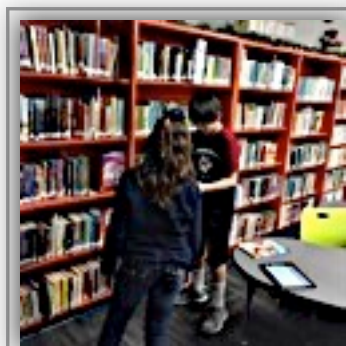
Parents Encouraging Parents (PEP) is a conference sponsored and funded by the Nebraska Department of Education. It is open to all Nebraska parents who are raising a child with a verified disability who are enrolled in a Nebraska school and have an active IFSP/IEP.

PEP is a conference for parents by parents. It's purpose is to bring parents of children with disabilities together in an accepting and confidential environment, giving them the opportunity to share ideas, feelings and common concerns, and to obtain information on parenting and educating a child with a disability. Parents will go home with renewed energy, hope, and a desire to work closely with professionals who serve their child. This is an amazing opportunity to network with others.

This year the conference will be in Kearney on March 16-18. There is NO registration fee. Two nights lodging and most meals are provided. Based on Daniel Wallace's 1998 novel *Big Fish: A Novel of Mythic Proportions*, the musical also shares much in common with the 2003 Movie **Big Fish** directed by Tim Burton and screenplay by John August. The story of this production revolves around Edward Bloom (**Ethan Hall**), who's outlandish stories have become an obstacle in the relationship with his son Will (**Connor Boehr**). Mediating this relationship is wife and mother Sandra Bloom (**Addie Swartzendruber**) and Will's fiance Josephine (**Kori Siebert**), who try to help the two men find common ground. Urgency to resolve their differences is added by the fact that Edward's health is failing and that Will is expecting a son of his own.

Through Edward's storytelling, we are introduced to several fantastic characters, including a Witch (**Megan Kroeker**) who can see his future, a Giant (**Aaron Buller**) who threatens his hometown, a Circus Ringmaster (**Zach Dente**) who holds the key to Edward's happiness, and a host of other personalities who teach Edward, and thereby Will, about life's secrets.

Students and teachers are hard at work to assemble a great show! Big production numbers, inventive choreography, inspiring and heartbreaking moments, and memorable characters are all being brought together to make **Big Fish** a musical to enjoyed by cast and audience alike!

Kindergarten Roundup Scheduled for February 24, 2017



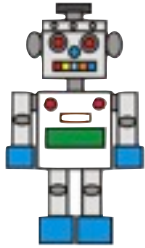
Heartland Community Schools will hold their Kindergarten Roundup on Friday, February 24, 2017, in the Kindergarten Room #1. Children who will be five years of age by July 31, 2017 are eligible for kindergarten in the fall of 2017 and should consider attending Roundup.

The purpose of Roundup is to provide an opportunity for next year's kindergarten students to meet Mrs. Thiesen and to meet other prospective kindergarteners. Two sessions will be held. The morning session will begin at 9:00AM and the afternoon session will begin at 1:00PM.

Parents will register their children for attendance at Heartland Community Schools in the Board Room with Elementary Principal, Sadie Houck. Parents should bring their child's **immunization records** with them as well as their child's **official birth certificate that includes the state seal**.

Nebraska birth certificates are available from: Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services; Division of Public Health, Vital Records, PO Box 95065, Lincoln, NE 68509-5065 or call them at 402-471-2871. All eligible children residing in the Heartland District whose names are on the current census list will receive an invitation to Roundup by February 3, 2017. If you are planning on optioning your child into the district, all option papers must be turned in by March 15, 2017, for the 2017-18 school year. If you know of a child who will be five by July 31, 2017 and for any reason may not have his or her name on the school census list, please call the school office at Heartland Community Schools at 402-723-4434.



Robotics Team 2016-2017

This is the second year for Heartland Community Schools to have a First Lego League (FLL) Robotics team. Every year, FIRST® releases a challenge based on a real world event. This year’s challenge is called “ANIMAL ALLIES.” The goal for all FLL teams is to find an innovative solution dealing with the interactions that occur between humans and animals. The teams identify a problem and come up with a solution while working through their core values. Students also program an EV3 robot to complete missions on the LEGO playing field. As part of the research process, team members went to the Central Nebraska Humane Society in Grand Island. Their time was spent touring the facility and spending time socializing with the dogs and cats. The teams have worked with Margalee Thomas on programming robots and running them through mazes. Coaches Carrie Regier and Marietta Adams are returning for second year coaching the teams. The Cy-Dawgs consist of **Wyatt Panko, Owen Mierau, Dawson Ohrt, Tyler Lewis, Lisa Buller, Aaron Goertzen, Karla Cool, Ayden Rea, Kevin Quiring, and Austin Wichman.** The Heartland Robobots consist of **Cooper Regier, Tobin Glinsmann, Lauren Quiring, Taylynn Scheil, Zach Wichman, Heath Perez, Josh Caldwell, Justin Caldwell, and Jamie Rowe.** The teams are preparing for their Qualifying Competition that was in Columbus on January 28, 2017.

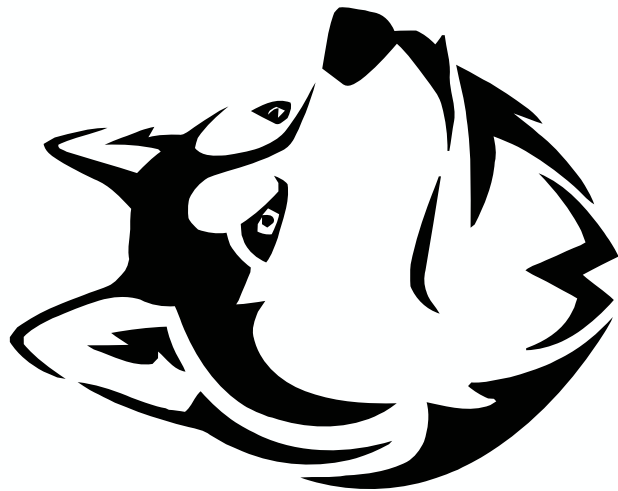

Band German Smorgasbord

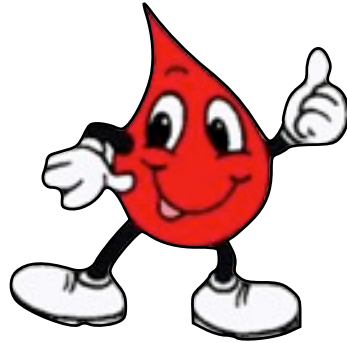
