NHS Walk-a-Thon



SPORTS PHYSICALS

A physical examination is required each year prior to participation in any athletic activity sponsored by the Nebraska School Activities Association. The physical examination is valid for one year from the date of exam and may be performed any time after May 1 prior to the next school year. These physicals are for all students entering grades 8-12 who will participate in sports for the 2010-11 school year. Payment of \$25.00 is required at the time of service.

SEVENTH GRADE PHYSICAL

A physical examination is required upon entry into 7th grade according to Nebraska LB59 law. The physical may be performed up to 6 months prior to the beginning of the school year in which your child is enrolled in 7th grade.

The clinic is requesting a parent/guardian to please accompany the student to the exam. If the student plans to participate in sports, the sports physical will be completed at the same time the 7th grade physical is performed.

All 7th grade students are required to have three doses of the Hepatitis B vaccine, two doses of MMR vaccine and the Varicella vaccine or a history of having chicken pox. Immunizations are available at the clinic or at a reduced cost at area immunization clinics.

Once the physical exam and immunizations are completed, the original physical form(s) should be returned to the school. This can be done any time prior to the first day of school. The cost of this physical is \$50.00. Immunizations are not included in this charge.

KINDERGARTEN PHYSICAL

A physical exam is required upon entry to kindergarten according to Nebraska LB59 law. This physical may be performed up to six months prior to the beginning of the school year in which your child is enrolled in kindergarten. The following immunizations are required upon entrance to kindergarten: 2 doses of MMR, 3 doses of Hepatitis, at least 3 doses of DPT and IPV, and one dose of Varivax (if your child has not had the chicken pox). Please bring your child's immunization records at the time of the physical so we can make sure their immunizations are current. Immunizations are available at the clinic or at area immunization clinics at a reduced cost.

Once the physical exam and immunizations are completed, the original physical form(s) should be returned to the school. This can be done any time prior to the first day of school. The cost of this physical is \$50.00. Immunizations are not included in this charge.

JANZEN AND YODER PLACE AT STATE TRACK MEET

Taylor Janzen repeated as Class C pole vault champion at the State Track Meet at Omaha Burke by clearing 10' 4". Jennifer Yoder was equally impressive finishing second in the 100 meter dash. Her time of 12.680 bettered her preliminary time of 12.754. The two girls combined for 18 points, giving Heartland a tie for ninth place with Hershey and Sutton.

The girls track team did have some unfortunate events. Jennifer Yoder false started in the preliminaries of the 200 meter dash. After finishing 4th in the 400 meter relay, the foursome of Taylor Janzen, Ashton Kroeker, Jennifer Goossen, and Jennifer Yoder was disqualified for passing the baton out of the exchange zone.

On the boys' side, sophomore Michael Brune cleared 11'6" in the pole vault to tie his personal best, and sophomore Brendan Denman ran 1600 meters in 5:00.803. The Heartland track teams have had a successful year with many athletes achieving personal bests throughout the season. Taylor Janzen and Michael Brune were named the most valuable athletes for the Heartland Track teams.


