## To our parents and supporters,

While the weather isn't necessarily cooperating, the calendar says that it is Spring. It has been a great school year so far and before we know it, we will be setting up for graduation and sending another class of students to find their way. We hope that we have provided a great range of experiences for all of our students and continually look for ways to expand the opportunities here at Heartland.

Last month, the board approved the use of federal grant monies to expand offerings. The grant will be used to purchase two pieces of equipment that utilize a computer to robotically control a laser engraver/cutter and a plasma cutter for metals. The equipment will be at the center of a business model that will involve students in the areas of artistic and computer design, accounting, and industrial technology and agricultural science. Some of the students will take orders, order supplies, calculate expenses, complete invoices, and balance the books. Others will work with the public to take ideas and produce designs at the quality expected by the customers and translate that design into a computer file. Others will work in the manufacturing area, taking those designs and using the equipment to create a finished product.

We are looking to develop a cross-discipline, real-world opportunity for students to experience what it is like to run a business and develop skills in many different areas. We hope to have all of the components in place over the summer. Our goal would be to offer some basic services prior to the holidays and expand those offerings during second semester of next year. Once we are running, we will certainly invite you in to learn more about this initiative.

## PowerSchool- Get the APP!

Many of you access grades through PowerSchool but don't have the app, the app; is a little more user friendly than through the computer. Parents and students can both use the app. One advantage is you don't have to log in every time. Simply open the app to view the account of your student(s). A second advantage; you will receive a notification with an up to date grade each time a teacher adds an assignment. Everything you check from the computer, you can check on the app. You will need to know the school's access code: GGXN. 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## Heartland Preschool Taking Applications for 2018-19 School Year

Heartland Preschool is now taking applications for the 2018-19 school year, which will begin August 15,2018 . There will again be two sessions, each running four days a week, Monday through Thursday. Mornings will be for 3-year olds and the afternoons will be for $4 \& 5$-year-olds. Children can attend two, three, or four sessions a week. The current cost for students to attend preschool is $\$ 65.00$ per month for 2 sessions a week; $\$ 97.50$ per month for 3 sessions a week; $\$ 130.00$ per month for 4 sessions a week. A cost increase may go into effect for the 2018-19 school year, pending approval by the Heartland School Board. Tuition will be billed monthly on the ist and is due on the roth of each month. Reduced or free tuition is also available for those families who qualify. Please let the school office know if you want to apply for tuition assistance. Children who are verified for special education services attend at the cost of the district, with no charge for the parents. Their schedule is determined by their Individual Education Plan (IEP).

Application forms are available for pick up in the Heartland School office. Interested parents should return the completed application to the office and they will be contacted in early June regarding enrollment.
