### To our parents and supporters,

### Breakfast/Lunch Prices for 2013-14

Breakfast and lunch prices have been set for the 2013-14 school year. Lunch prices for students in grades K-6 are \$2.65 per meal, 7th-12th are \$2.75, employees are \$3.30 and guests are \$4.00. Students who qualify for reduced price meals will pay \$0.40. Breakfast prices are \$1.50 for students and \$1.75 for adults. Students who qualify for reduced price meals will pay \$0.20. The milk price is \$0.40.

Kindergarten students will have their afternoon milk included in their lunch accounts. This amount is entered on your child's lunch account every two weeks. ***We ask that all families keep their lunch accounts in a positive balance.*** A note will be sent home with your child every week when the account reaches a balance of \$10.00 or below.

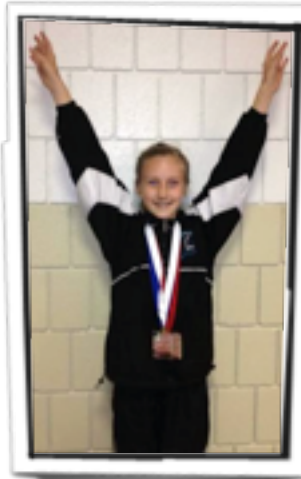

## No Child Left Behind Act

### Asbestos Notification

**The** Environmental Protection Agency regulation requires that all patrons and employees of the Heartland Community Schools be notified as to the location of asbestos-containing materials in the school building.

**Recent** inspections conducted by ATC Environmental, Inc. of Omaha confirmed earlier inspections containing asbestos particles in several locations in the school. These are located in the old gym, the stage and several maintenance storage areas. Although the pipe insulation does contain asbestos particles, ATC Environmental Inc. found them to be properly encapsulated and therefore pose no threat to the students or employees of Heartland Community Schools.

**Management** plans, as required by law, have been filed with the State Health Department and should the materials become damaged in any way, the proper action will be taken by school personnel to insure a safe environment for all students and employees. School Maintenance Director, Matt Quiring has received special training, as required by the EPA, to deal with any asbestos related incidents. If any employees have questions or observe any damage to any asbestos covered materials, they should contact the superintendent's office. A detailed diagram of existing asbestos locations in the school building may be obtained from the superintendent's office. A copy of the management plan is available for public inspection in the superintendent's office.

### Nebraska Ambassador of Music European Trip

Sam, Andrea and Mary Boardman along with Heartland band director, Royce Schweitzer traveled with the Nebraska Ambassadors of Music through seven European countries from June 9-24th. Mr. Schweitzer has been a staff member of this group since 1991. The Nebraska Ambassadors of Music has headquarters in Denver, CO with about 40 states representing the United States as they visit continental Europe every 2 years. Sam and the Nebraska group traveled to England, France, Switzerland, Austria Liechtenstein, Italy and Germany.

The band performed five concerts during their trip, so much of the time was spent seeing a lot of fabulous sights in Europe. All of the concerts are very well attended by the Europeans. One of the most responsive crowds is the Switzerland concert. One year the group had to play 5 encore selections.

Sam said, "We were always on the go! I can't even explain all of the things we were able to see. It was incredible." Mr. Schweitzer added "Even though I have been on this trip many times it never becomes old. I is always fascinating to see all of the Europeans sights firsthand that I have read about. It was really great to be able to share this trip with the Boardman family. Sam and her trumpet represented the state of Nebraska very well!" The Nebraska Ambassadors of Music will again travel to Europe in 2015.

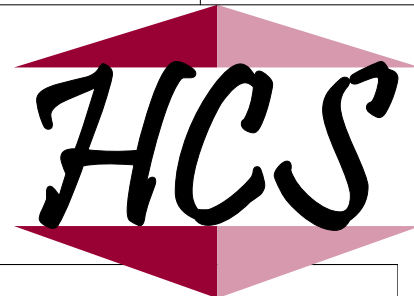

If we use one snow day, the last day of school will move to May 19th, two snow days, May 20th, etc. We will make every attempt to end the year prior to Memorial Day, but this may require additional adjustments to the calendar.

### REMINDER

All 7th grade and Kindergarten physicals must be completed before school starts. If your child is participating in sports, their athletic physicals must be completed and turned into the office before they can participate.

Physicals can be scheduled at Henderson Health Care between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Payment is required at the time of service.
