Congratulations to the DIGI-MINDS and the Astro Hackers

On Saturday, January 12th, 2019, Heartland's FIRST Lego League robotics teams competed in the Columbus Qualifier Event in Columbus, Nebraska. The Astro Hackers (6th Grade) and DIGI-MINDS (JH) have been putting in countless hours gearing up for this event. Both teams had to identify a physical or social problem faced by humans during long duration space exploration and propose a solution. The Astro Hackers developed an exercise device called "Muscle Madness" that would give astronauts an opportunity to use resistance bands to do upper body exercises such as pull-ups. The DIGI-MINDS created scented bands they call "Sniff Snap" that uses lavender blooms, coffee beans and chopped up corn cobs infused with different essential oils. The bands were created to remind astronauts of smells on Earth as well as relieve stress and improve concentration. After the morning judging rounds (Project, Core Valves, Robot Design), the teams spent the afternoon competing in the Robot Games. These games are exciting and very intense due to the fact that the teams only have 2.5 minutes to complete their missions. We are proud to report that both Heartland teams completed a perfect run! The Astro Hackers finished with a score of 135 to earn 2nd place in the game portion while the DIGI-MINDS finished with a score of 100 to earn 4th place. After all the judging was completed, it was announced that both Heartland teams had qualified for the state competition along with 14 other teams. There were a total of 39 teams at the event. The DIGI-MINDS also won the Robot Design Award for their excellence in mechanical design, innovation, and programming effectiveness and strategy. A HUGE congratulations to all the robotics students!

The state competition will be on Saturday, February 16th at SAC Museum

Make better beverage choices

A healthy eating style includes all foods and beverages. Many beverages contain added sugars and offer little or no nutrients, while others may provide nutrients but too many calories from saturated fat. Here are some tips to help you make better beverage choices.

Drink water Drink water instead of sugary drinks. Non-diet soda, energy or sports drinks, and other sugarsweetened drinks contain a lot of calories from added sugars and few nutrients.



How much water is enough? Let your thirst be your guide. Everyone's needs are different. Most of us get enough water from the foods we eat and the beverages we drink. A healthy body can balance water needs throughout the day. Drink plenty of water if you are very active or live or work in hot conditions.

A thrifty option Water is usually easy on the wallet. You can save money by drinking water from the tap at home or when eating out.

Manage your calories Drink water with and between your meals. Adults and children take in about 400 calories per day as beverages—drinking water can help you manage your calories

Kid-friendly drink zone Make water, low-fat or fat-free milk, or 100% juice an easy option in your home. Have ready-to-go containers available in the refrigerator. Place them in lunch boxes or backpacks for easy access when kids are away from home. Depending on age, children can drink 1/2 to 1 cup, and adults can drink up to 1 cup of 100% fruit or vegetable juice* each day.

*100% juice is part of the Fruit or Vegetable Group.

Don't forget your dairy**

Select low-fat or fat-free milk or fortified soy beverages. They offer key nutrients such as calcium, vitamin D, and potassium. Older children, teens, and adults need 3 cups of milk per day, while children 4 to 8 years old need 21/2 cups and children 2 to 3 years old need 2 cups.

Enjoy your beverage

When water just won't do-enjoy the beverage of your choice, but just cut back. Remember to check the serving size and the number of servings in the can, bottle, or container to stay within calorie needs. Select smaller cans, cups, or glasses instead of large or supersized options.

Water on the go Water is always convenient. Fill a clean, reusable water bottle and toss it in your bag or briefcase to quench your thirst throughout the day. Reusable bottles are also easy on the environment.

Check the facts

Use the Nutrition Facts label to choose beverages at the grocery store. The food label and ingredients list contain information about added sugars, saturated fat, sodium, and calories to help you make better choices.

Compare what you drink Food-A-Pedia, an online feature available at SuperTracker.usda.gov, can help you compare calories, added sugars, and fats in your favorite beverages.

** Milk is a part of the Dairy Group. A cup = 1 cup of milk or yogurt. 1½ ounces of natural cheese, or 2 ounces of processed cheese.


