t has been an interesting school year with the ever-changing protocols related to COVID. The staff and students continue to press forward with safe practices and if we need to do this through the end of the year, we will. We are hopeful that if everyone does their best now, we will be back to what we would consider "normal" this next fall. Thank you for your continued support!
Every year, we look at data and feedback when considering areas of focus for the next school year. This school improvement process is fluid and adapted to priorities that may arise. Up to this point, most of this work has been accomplished within our community and without procedural guidance from an outside group. Every so often, however, we all need to step back and be open to help and advice from experts from outside our school or community. The school board embarked on this process with the Nebraska Association of School Boards a year ago. Unfortunately, the opportunities to meet with community members to gather input has been difficult with restrictions on gatherings. At the January meeting, the board decided to pause the process until this fall and are hopeful that we can have the opportunity to discuss the future of our school district in face-to-face meetings with our constituents. Stay tuned!
Another state requirement is that we have a team of outside experts visit our school and, based upon international standards, evaluate our effectiveness and grant us accreditation every five years. This team from a group called Cognia will be conducting their research in March of this year and will provide us this feedback. The last time they were here in 2016, we received very high ratings and some quality direction for improvement. This year, they will have to conduct this visit remotely, so it will be interesting not having them get "the feel of the school", which we hold as a very important quality. Our staff is extremely busy compiling a small book to address all of the standards and we will be transparent and confident in the systems that we have in place.
As part of our accreditation visit, we will be conducting surveys of various groups. If you are a community member, but do not have children in school, please complete the brief, eighteen question Community Engagement Survey at https://bit.ly/3bXNbTq
