## To our parents and supporters,

Students are enjoying their first few days of summer. All at home are adjusting to new schedules. Teachers are finalizing grades and organizing their rooms and the administration and summer staff have started preparations for the next school year. It is amazing how fast some years pass and this last school year was no exception. Thank you for your continued support for what was an enjoyable and successful year of learning at Heartland.

We have a few things planned for the summer. We will be resurfacing and re-painting the track as it has been 7 years since it was installed. Doing the proper maintenance each year is very important to having a great facility. The "new" gym and theater addition is now 30 years old! We will have a crew in this summer to complete repairs on the mortar joints in many areas and make sure that the walls are sealed to the weather. Once that is complete we have some painting that needs to be completed in addition to the refinishing of the gym floors. The entry doors for that addition also have 30 years of heavy use for activities and are difficult at times to secure. They will be replaced over the summer.

The roof over the old gymnasium will be replaced and is the last roof surface to be updated within the last io years. It is starting to show its age and leaks have started to be an issue, so we definitely got our money out of that old roof. There are two interior courtyards within our building that have windows into two hallways. Many years ago, for energy efficiency, these windows were covered with insulated panels. Those panels are now starting to de-laminate and either need to be replaced or opened back up using energy efficient glass. We are planning to put glass back in those openings to allow more natural light back in the building and at the same or better energy energy efficiency. We do not want to have overgrown courtyard areas to look at, however. Our plan is to do some landscaping in one of the areas and turn the other into an outdoor classroom for science, math, and agriculture classes. It will take time and effort to make this happen, so once a plan is in place, we may be sending out a plea for some help. By this time next year, those areas should be a very nice addition back into our school environment.

We hope that you are not as busy this summer and find some time to relax and enjoy the family. Best wishes for a safe and enjoyable summer!

## SPORTS PHYSICALS

A physical examination is required each year prior to participation in any athletic activity sponsored by the Nebraska School Activities Association. The physical examination is valid for one year from the date of the exam and may be performed any time after May i prior to the next school year. These physicals are for all students entering grades $7-12$ who will participate in sports for the 2016-17 school year. Payment of $\$ 25.00$ is required at the time of service. You will need to use the school physical form as your verification.

## SEVENTH GRADE PHYSICAL

A physical examination is required upon entry into 7 th grade according to Nebraska LB59 law. The physical may be performed up to 6 months prior to the beginning of the school year in which your child is enrolled in 7 th grade.

The clinic is requesting a parent/guardian to please accompany the student to the exam. If the student plans to participate in sports, the sports physical will be completed at the same time the 7 th grade physical is performed.

All 7th grade students are required to have three doses of the Hepatitis B vaccine, two doses of MMR vaccine and two doses of the Varicella vaccine or a history of having chicken pox. Immunizations are available at the clinic or for a reduced cost at area immunization clinics.

Once the physical exam and immunizations are completed, the original physical form(s) should be returned to the school. This can be done any time prior to the first day of school. The cost of this physical is \$50.00. Immunizations are not included in this charge.

## KINDERGARTEN PHYSICAL

A physical exam is required upon entry to kindergarten according to Nebraska LB59 law. This physical may be performed up to six months prior to the beginning of the school year in which your child is enrolled in kindergarten.

The following immunizations are required upon entrance to kindergarten: two doses of MMR, 3 doses of Hepatitis, at least 3 doses of DPT and IPV, and two doses of the Varicella vaccine (if your child has not had the chicken pox). Please bring your child's immunization records at the time of the physical so we can make sure their immunizations are current. Immunizations are available at the clinic or at area immunization clinics for a reduced cost.

Once the physical exam and immunizations are completed, the original physical form(s) should be returned to the school. This can be done any time prior to the first day of school. The cost of this physical is $\$ 75.00$. Immunizations are not included in this charge.

## Physicals can be scheduled at Henderson Health Care between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Payment is required at the time of service.
