## SPORTS PHYSICALS

A physical examination is required each year prior participation in any athletic activity sponsored by the Nebraska School Activities Association. The physical examination is valid for one year from the date of the exam and may be performed any time after May 1 prior to the next school year. These physicals are for all students entering grades 8-12 who will participate in sports for the 2013-14 school year. Payment of \$25.00 is required at the time of service. You will need to use the school physical form from Heartland as your verification.

## SEVENTH GRADE PHYSICAL

A physical examination is required upon entry into 7th grade according to Nebraska LB59 law. The physical may be performed up to 6 months prior to the beginning of the school year in which your child is enrolled in 7th grade.

The clinic is requesting a parent/guardian to please accompany the student to the exam. If the student plans to participate in sports, the sports physical will be completed at the same time the 7th grade physical is performed.

All 7th grade students are required to have three doses of the Hepatitis B vaccine, two doses of MMR vaccine and two doses of the Varicella vaccine or a history of having chicken pox. Immunizations are available at the clinic or for a reduced cost at area immunization clinics.

Once the physical exam and immunizations are completed, the original physical form(s) should be returned to the school. This can be done any time prior to the first day of school. The cost of this physical is \$50.00. Immunizations are not included in this charge.

## KINDERGARTEN PHYSICAL

A physical exam is required upon entry to kindergarten according to Nebraska LB59 law. This physical may be performed up to six months prior to the beginning of the school year in which your child is enrolled in kindergarten.

The following immunizations are required upon entrance to kindergarten: two doses of MMR, 3 doses of Hepatitis, at least 3 doses of DPT and IPV, and two doses of the Varicella vaccine (if your child has not had the chicken pox). Please bring your child's immunization records at the time of the physical so we can make sure their immunizations are current. Immunizations are available at the clinic or at area immunization clinics for a reduced cost.

Once the physical exam and immunizations are completed, the original physical form(s) should be returned to the school. This can be done any time prior to the first day of school. The cost of this physical is \$75.00. Immunizations are not included in this charge.

**Physicals can be scheduled at Henderson Health Care between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Payment is required at the time of service.**

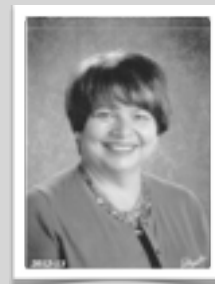

## HUSKIES PLACE TWO AT STATE TRACK MEET

Having qualified 12 athletes at the district track meet, the Heartland Huskies had two athletes place at the state track meet. **Ashton Kroeker** finished fourth in the triple jump with a mark of 34' 9.75". Ashton holds the school triple jump record of 35' 8" that she set at the Sutton Invite earlier this season. **Bailey Carr** tied for 5<sup>th</sup> in the pole vault, tying her personal best of 9' 6". The Heartland girls' track team accumulated 8.5 points to finish in 27<sup>th</sup> place.

The girls' 400 relay team of **Bailey Carr, Ashton Kroeker, Sara Brune, and Sidney Dick** finished 12<sup>th</sup> in a time of 52.94. The 1600 relay quartet of **Ashton Kroeker, Kaitlyn Quiring, Kelli Bergen, and Sara Brune** finished 10<sup>th</sup> with a time of 4:23.34. **Sara Brune** finished 5<sup>th</sup> in her heat of the 100 meter hurdles with a clocking of 17.38. **Allison Braun** finished in 22<sup>nd</sup> place in the 800 meter run with a time of 2:35.88. **Ashton Kroeker** missed qualifying by .03 second in the 200 meter dash with a 27.26. **Katriina Autio** finished in 20<sup>th</sup> place in the 1600 meter run in 6:19.17.

On the boys side, the 400 relay team of **Tyler Brown, Cole Nickels, Jordan Heinrichs, and Sebastian Jaekel** finished 13<sup>th</sup> in a time 46.07. **Dillon Scheil** vaulted 11'0" to finish in 17<sup>th</sup> place. **Cole Nickels** leaped 5'10" tying his personal best to place 17<sup>th</sup> in the high jump. In the long jump **Jordan Heinrichs** recorded a mark of 18'8.25" to finish in 22<sup>nd</sup> place. **Tyler Brown** competed in the 100 meter dash with a time of 11.78 seconds and finished 6<sup>th</sup> in his heat. **Jordan Heinrichs** competed in the 300 hurdles with a time of 44.51 seconds and finished 7<sup>th</sup> in his heat.

Head track coach **Larry Vancura** commented: "Despite the weather conditions both the Heartland Sr. High and Jr. High track teams had a great season. The athletes always practiced well and were very competitive in their events. We did extremely well in the district meet, with the girls finishing second and the boys finishing fourth. I would like to thank all the seniors for their contributions the last 4 years. They were a great group to coach." The track team and coaches voted **Ashton Kroeker** and **Sara Brune** as Co-MVP's for the girls team and **Daniel Quiring** and **Jordan Heinrichs** as Co-MVP's for the boys team.
