

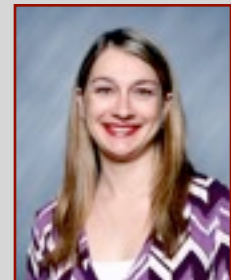

## be a healthy role model for children



### 10 tips for setting good examples

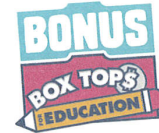
**You are the most important influence on your child.** You can do many things to help your children develop healthy eating habits for life. Offering a variety of foods helps children get the nutrients they need from every food group. They will also be more likely to try new foods and to like more foods. When children develop a taste for many types of foods, it's easier to plan family meals. Cook together, eat together, talk together, and make mealtime a family time!

- 1 show by example**  
Eat vegetables, fruits, and whole grains with meals or as snacks. Let your child see that you like to munch on raw vegetables.
- 2 go food shopping together**  
Grocery shopping can teach your child about food and nutrition. Discuss where vegetables, fruits, grains, dairy, and protein foods come from. Let your children make healthy choices.
- 3 get creative in the kitchen**  
Cut food into fun and easy shapes with cookie cutters. Name a food your child helps make. Serve "Janie's Salad" or "Jackie's Sweet Potatoes" for dinner. Encourage your child to invent new snacks. Make your own trail mixes from dry whole-grain, low-sugar cereal and dried fruit.
- 4 offer the same foods for everyone**  
Stop being a "short-order cook" by making different dishes to please children. It's easier to plan family meals when everyone eats the same foods.
- 5 reward with attention, not food**  
Show your love with hugs and kisses. Comfort with hugs and talks. Choose not to offer sweets as rewards. It lets your child think sweets or dessert foods are better than other foods. When meals are not eaten, kids do not need "extras"—such as candy or cookies—as replacement foods.
- 6 focus on each other at the table**  
Talk about fun and happy things at mealtime. Turn off the television. Take phone calls later. Try to make eating meals a stress-free time.
- 7 listen to your child**  
If your child says he or she is hungry, offer a small, healthy snack—even if it is not a scheduled time to eat. Offer choices. Ask "Which would you like for dinner: broccoli or cauliflower?" instead of "Do you want broccoli for dinner?"
- 8 limit screen time**  
Allow no more than 2 hours a day of screen time like TV and computer games. Get up and move during commercials to get some physical activity.
- 9 encourage physical activity**  
Make physical activity fun for the whole family. Involve your children in the planning. Walk, run, and play with your child—instead of sitting on the sidelines. Set an example by being physically active and using safety gear, like bike helmets.
- 10 be a good food role model**  
Try new foods yourself. Describe its taste, texture, and smell. Offer one new food at a time. Serve something your child likes along with the new food. Offer new foods at the beginning of a meal, when your child is very hungry. Avoid lecturing or forcing your child to eat.

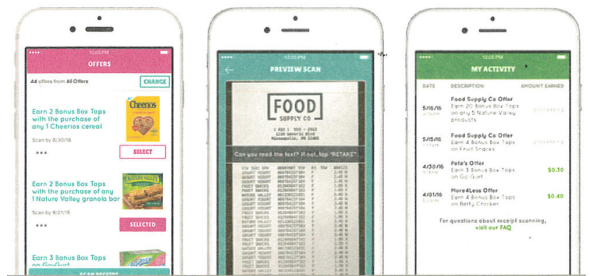

### Seniors...a reminder of what to do this fall

There's A LOT going on right now with the financial aid and college admission processes, but don't get overwhelmed! Here's a recap of tasks you should complete this fall to stay on track to college.

#### Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (**FAFSA**)

- First, create an FSA ID for you and one for a parent at [fsaid.ed.gov](https://fsaid.ed.gov). You'll need it to access and sign the FAFSA. Check [www.educationquest.org](http://www.educationquest.org) for a video with FAFSA instructions.
- Review EducationQuest's [FAFSA Checklist](#) on their website so you'll know what documents to gather before you start the form.
- Find free [FAFSA Tools](#) at EducationQuest.org to help you through the process.
- For free personal help, call EducationQuest to make an appointment: Omaha – 888.357.6300, Lincoln – 800.303.3745, Kearney – 800.666.3721, or Scottsbluff – 800.303.3745, ext. 6654.

**Retake the ACT and/or SAT.** Colleges use your best scores for college admission and scholarships.

Four Corners Health Department is concerned with the health of you and your family.

We would like to share with you some facts about Whooping Cough, or pertussis as we have had recent cases in young and school-aged children. Now that school year has started, we would like to share with you more about Whooping Cough.

Whooping Cough is very serious illness that affects the lungs and breathing tubes, causing violent coughing you cannot stop. It is easily spread to other people through the air by coughing and sneezing. It is most harmful for young babies and can be deadly. The DTAP vaccine protects against whooping cough.

Watch for the signs of whooping cough. Whooping cough starts with:

- Runny or stuffed-up nose
- Sneezing
- Mild cough
- A pause in breathing in infants
- After 1 to 2 weeks, coughing, which can be severe, starts and:
- Children and babies can cough very hard, over, and over
- When children gasp for breath after a coughing fit, they make a “whooping” sound
- Coughing can make it hard to breathe, eat, drink, or sleep
- Coughing fits happen more at night
- Coughing can include vomiting
- Babies and young children may turn blue while coughing from lack of oxygen.

If you or your children have these signs, check with your family physician and be tested. The good news is that the illness can be treated with antibiotics. If you have any questions please call the Four Corners Health Department at (402-) 362-2621 or toll free (877) 337-3573

**Preschool News:**

*Ch.I.L.D. Day Provided by Heartland Community School*

*The Heartland Community School is setting aside a special time for parents of children age 5 and below to participate in Ch.I.L.D. Day, which stands for Childhood Information on Language and Development. Just as parents take their young children to the doctor for medical check-ups, the school can provide to parents the services of a “developmental wellness visit”.The early childhood personnel at the school can provide current and useful information to parents concerning the early development of their baby, toddler, or preschooler.*

*Ch.I.L.D. Day is a childfind effort conducted by the Heartland Community School District. School districts are required to conduct childfind activities to ensure that young children who need early intervention services are identified. Involvement in Ch.I.L.D. Day is a free, completely voluntary service and is conducted in a confidential manner.*

*Ch.I.L.D. Day is set for Friday, November 17 from 8:00am-4:00p.m. For babies and toddlers under age 3, we will be meeting in family homes so that the children will feel more comfortable in their natural environment. For children ages 3-5, we will be meeting in the Heartland Preschool room at the school.*

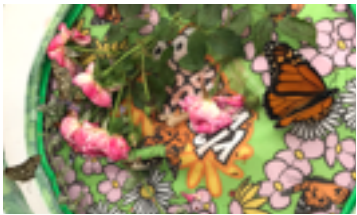
*Interested parents who live in the Heartland School District can call the school office in Henderson to register for a time slot when the early intervention specialists can meet with their child. Parents will be able to ask questions about their child’s development, complete a developmental checklist, and have their child play and interact informally with adults knowledgeable about young children. Further information may need to be gathered at a later time if the parents and school staff see any concerns. Parental permission is required for any further evaluation.*
