## From Brad Best, Superintendent...

To our parents and supporters,
As part of the school accreditation process through the Nebraska Department of Education, schools must conduct self-evaluations of performance data, demographic data, and feedback from teachers, students, and district patrons. At the beginning of a new evaluation cycle, this information is used to set new school improvement goals for the district. We have been working on a set of goals and have collected information over the few years to help us determine the progress we have made.

At the end of this 5 -year cycle, a team of educators from various districts across the state will visit our school for a two-day period and pour through the evidence that we have collected and utilized in this process. During this visit, they will offer observations about the things we have done well and make suggestions as to what we may consider in our new set of goals for the subsequent cycle.

One of the pieces of data that the external team will want to review is feedback from you, our patrons. There is an online survey produced by the accreditation organization that we are asking you to complete. The link to the survey may be found on our website at www.heartlandschools.org. Look for the survey link under Quick Links on the right side of the page.

I am confident that we are doing the right work and welcome the input to the process. At our last professional development day, the staff spent time completing a self-evaluation for this process. We had very good discussions surrounding school improvement, our own ratings on how well we address the standards for excellent school systems, and working in committees to provide details for the evaluation. We also spent time hearing a presentation on how to work with students that live in poverty. Our percentage of students living in these conditions has increased ro $\%$ over the last 15 years, bringing our poverty percentage to $30 \%$. We learned some valuable techniques and will continue these discussions.

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## FBLA MEMBERS ATTEND FALL LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

The Nebraska FBLA Fall Leadership Conference was held in Kearney on September 29th. This conference was a one-day workshop for FBLA officers and members to learn about the state goals. This year's state theme is "CONNECT."

The 2015-16 state goals spell out UNITE. Utilize: publish a website to aid local secretaries, create a template on how to write an article, promote parliamentary procedures resources, update the SLC Survival Guide and update the competitive event resources. Network: collaborate with another CTSO, FBLA chapter or school club on a state project, increase social media presence by reaching 1,500 likes on Facebook and 1,300 followers on Twitter, create monthly webinars and boost local chapter activities. Involve: encourage chapters to participate in Seven Up, increase involvement in state and national projects, have $25 \%$ of total local chapters complete one section of the Chapter Challenge, spread awareness of the March of Dimes and increase state participation by ıо $\%$ in the Business Achievement Awards. Target: charter or reactivate 5 chapters, charter 2 middle level chapters, tally it up to 27,000 service hours, donate $\$ 15,000$ to the Nebraska FBLA Foundation and raise $\$ 17,000$ for March of Dimes. Educate: promote the Community Service Awards, inform students about state and national deadlines, educate students about financial literacy and post weekly tip, tricks and reminders on social media.

The keynote speaker at the general session was Kevin Wanzer from Indianapolis, Indiana. His presentation was titled, "Empowering Audiences One Laugh at a Time." In his fast-paced, hilarious, yet touching keynote address, he
recalled and reinforced essential life and love lessons. He reminded us that success in life ultimately comes down to finding joy in everyday situations and the importance of who and what we choose to love. Following the general session, the officers and members attended individual workshops on getting involved with FBLA, the Foundation, Program of Work and the March of Dimes.

## Ch.I.L.D. Day Provided by Heartland Community School

The Heartland Community School is setting aside a special time for parents of children age 5 and below to participate in Ch.I.L.D. Day, which stands for Childhood Information on Language and Development. Just as parents take their young children to the doctor for medical check-ups, the school can provide to parents the services of a "developmental wellness visit". The early childhood personnel at the school can provide current and useful information to parents concerning the early development of their baby, toddler, or preschooler.

Ch.I.L.D. Day is a child find effort conducted by the Heartland Community School District. School
districts are required to conduct child find activities to ensure that young children who need early intervention services are identified. Involvement in Ch.I.L.D. Day is a free, completely voluntary service and is conducted in a confidential manner.

Ch.I.L.D. Day is set for Friday, Nov. 20 from 8:30am-4:30p.m. For babies and toddlers under age 3 , we will be meeting in family homes so that the children will feel more comfortable in their natural environment. For children ages $3-5$, we will be meeting in the Heartland Preschool room at the school.

Interested parents who live in the Heartland School District can call the school office in Henderson to register for a time slot when the early intervention specialists can meet with
their child. Parents will be able to ask questions about their child's development, complete a developmental checklist, and have their child play and interact informally with adults knowledgeable about young children. Further information may need to be gathered at a later time if the parents and school staff see any concerns. Parental permission is required for any further evaluation.
The Heartland Community School wishes to extend this invitation as one way of providing support and information to parents of young children in our district. Again, parents of young children in the Heartland school district are invited to call the school at 402-723-4434 to register for Ch.I.L.D. Day.
