From Brad Best, Superintendent... To our parents and supporters,

Fall is officially upon us and school is in full swing! It has been a great start to a new year and we appreciate the support that you have given us in making sure that your children are here and ready to learn each day.

This last month, the board of education approved the budget for the 2015-16 school year. Our tax asking for the general fund decreased 3.2% or about \$139,000. The land valuation in our district increased 11% from last year to nearly \$823 million. We will have a slight increase in our asking for the QCPUF fund so that we may pay off bonds early and save some interest. Our total tax asking of our patrons across all funds will decrease for the second year in a row! We have been able to decrease our budget while completing curriculum and building updates due to the securing of additional state funds and through changes in our staffing. The overall levy for all funds next year is projected to be slightly over 55 cents per \$100 valuation, which is down almost 7 cents from the 2014-2015 school year.

We are doing well financially and are looking at ways to enhance programming and building improvements within spending limits and while keeping our growth in tax asking low. Our number one priority is to provide a quality education to our children and I believe that we are in a great position to continue that effort. We appreciate your support and take our fiscal responsibility to you very seriously.

In the fall of 2012, the elementary teachers implemented a new reading series in grades K-6. Our reading scores continue to grow with this renewed effort. This fall, we have updated our math curriculum and teachers have received training on its implementation. We are excited about the updates and the hard work that our teachers are putting forth to teach reading and math with fidelity to the researched based programs. This fall, we will be analyzing our science curriculum and look to update those materials in the fall of 2016.

Have a great fall and please plan to participate in our school activities and parent/teacher conferences on September 28th & October 5th.


Elementary Classroom Highlights


