CURRICULUM EVALUATION

When a new program is proposed or significant changes occur, a report will be made to the board describing the process employed and the reasons for the curriculum change.

The board shall review the students' performance on standardized tests, courses, and other indicators of student achievement deemed relevant by the board as a guideline for the effectiveness of the curriculum. It shall be the responsibility of the superintendent to provide the board with the test scores along with the superintendent's comments about the school district's curriculum.
